He is the recipient of numerous awards including the Order of Canada, Alberta Award of Excellence and has been inducted into seven Sports Halls of Fame for his Olympic and athletic accomplishments. A founder of the World and North American Indigenous games, Willie continues to compete nationally and internationally in both Canadian and Indigenous competitions.

Allan has been the recipient of numerous awards recognizing his outstanding contributions to business, education and philanthropy in Canada and abroad.
