Maskwacis Youth Expo Connects Youth with Career Opportunities and Resources

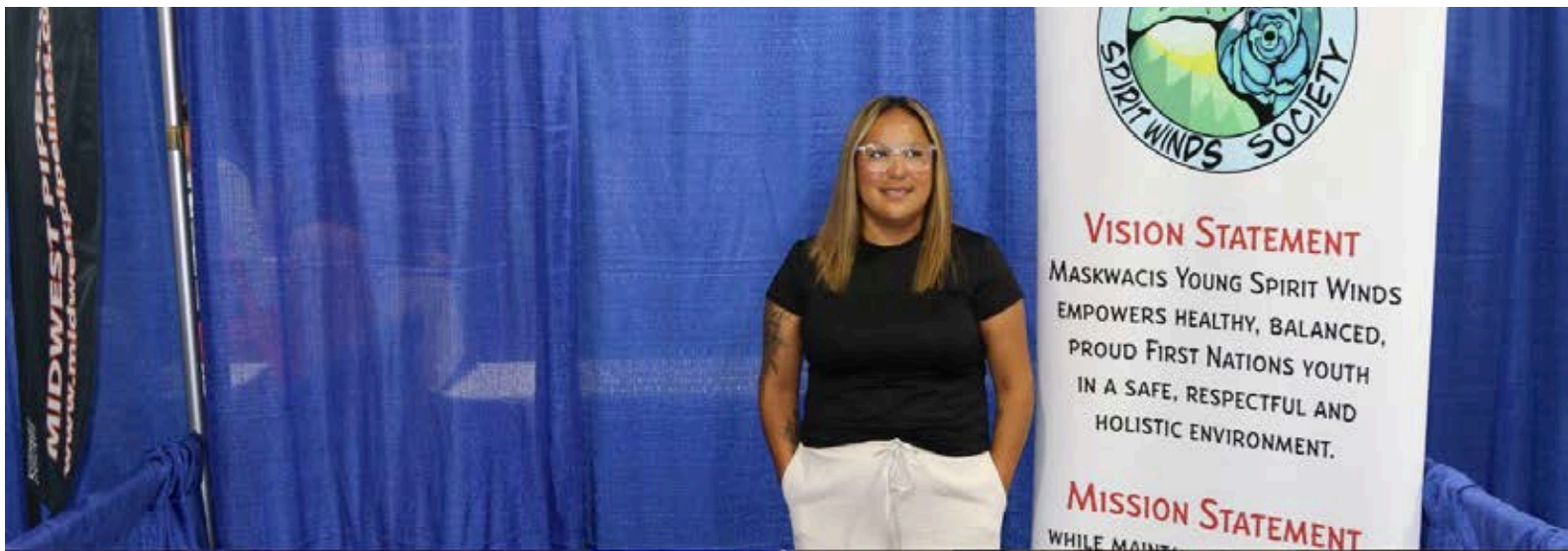


The event offered more than just career information, with snacks, door prizes, and a photo booth adding some fun to the day and creating an inviting environment for youth to connect and participate.

Bringing the Four Nations Together: A Traditional Birthing Ceremony at Bear Park



A beautiful gathering took place at Bear Park in Ermineskin, bringing together the Four Nations of Maskwacis—Ermineskin Cree Nation, Montana First Nation, Samson Cree Nation and Louis Bull Tribe—to honour the sacred journey of pregnancy, birth and motherhood through traditional teachings and ceremony.

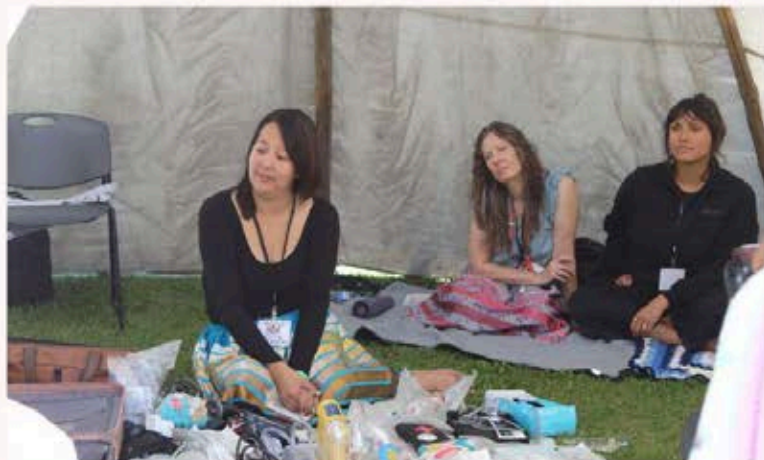


The gathering also reflected the principle of Wâhkôhtowin—kinship and being related to one another. Community supports throughout Maskwacis continue to create opportunities for mothers, fathers, parents-to-be and families to learn from Elders, participate in cultural practices and build stronger connections.

The Birthing Ceremony was a celebration of culture, family and community, with each Nation contributing to the gathering. Tipis were raised throughout Bear Park, creating spaces where families could gather, learn and connect with traditional teachings surrounding pregnancy, birth and welcoming a new life into the community.

Bringing the Four Nations together for an event centred around birth carries a special meaning. In Maskwacis, the Nations share strong cultural and kinship connections, and community-led approaches to maternal and child well-being have long emphasized the importance of combining cultural knowledge with health and family supports. Research and community programs in Maskwacis have highlighted the importance of culturally informed prenatal and perinatal care, with Elders, families and community members playing an important role in sharing knowledge and supporting one

A MOTHER'S LEGACY, A FAMILY'S STRENGTH: THE MONTOUR SPARTAN JOURNEY



Honouring Our Mother Through Strength & Resilience

On August 8–9, 2026, siblings Krista and Christopher Montour took on the Spartan Races in Red Deer, Alberta, in honour and remembrance of their late mother, Roma Blanche Montour – Kamamak Iskewew (Butterfly Woman).

Their mother was a strong advocate for health and fitness throughout her life. Krista remembers watching her exercise as a child, whether through cardio, weights, or long walks with ankle weights. Even after battling cancer and entering remission, Roma continued to prioritize her health and inspire those around her. Her dedication to fitness became something her children carried forward.

The Spartan weekend became especially meaningful for the siblings. Christopher completed his first Spartan Trifecta, covering a total of 43 kilometres over 19 hours across the weekend. During his 28.2-kilometre Beast Race, he found himself ready to give up and said a prayer to his late mother. Shortly afterward, a yellow butterfly appeared in front of him, remaining nearby during his race—a moment he felt was a powerful sign that his mother was with him.



Krista completed her first Spartan Race, joining her brother for the final 5 kilometres. Together, they pushed through the challenges while honouring their mother's memory. Their journey was more than a race—it was a **celebration of family, strength, resilience and remembrance**, carrying Roma's spirit with them every step of the way.
